Peer Review Process

Acta Universitatis Sapientiae is a double-blind peer-reviewed scientific journal. All submitted manuscripts are reviewed by two anonymous referees. Reviewers are selected according to their expertise in their particular field of research, identified as specialists in the respective academic area.

Submitted manuscripts should be edited according to the *Instructions for Authors* on the journal's website.

Evaluation criteria are determined by the editorial boards for each series.

Authors are expected to submit original manuscripts that reflect the results of their personal scientific work. Manuscripts sent to the journal must not be previously published in other journals and should not be considered for publication by other journals. Authors are also required to prepare their papers carefully, including reference to any paper whose data or results they have made use of, clearly indicating their own contribution and results.

The reviewer's decision includes one of the three recommendations as follows: (1) acceptance in the initial form, (2) conditional acceptance (minor/moderate/major changes in form, style, and/or content), or (3) rejection. In case there is a significant difference between the two reviewers' recommendations, the opinion of a third referee is sought to reach the final decision.

The evaluation decision will be communicated to the author(s) within a period of not more than one month.
